How glad and grateful I am that things worked out this way. I think this is an extraordinary and lively congregation. I so admire my colleagues, Martha and Shumaila, the appointed officers here, and so so many volunteers. I am glad when I see children and youth show up Sunday after Sunday. Not to mention the hard work of many on Sunday services, both the musicians led wonderfully by Ron and Sally, the altar guild, and all the people who work behind the scenes (greeting, sound, hospitality, food). I have been astonished by the mutual care and hospitality I've seen here and by your concern for the community and the wider world.

My time as priest-in-charge is soon coming to an end. I am grateful to all of you for this grand opportunity. And I'll keep praying for you and the next incumbent (lucky priest!).

Thank you one and all for your gracious partnership with God, with each other, and with me in advancing God's Reign through the ministry of Christ Church Brampton.

# Holy Week 2025 & Confirmation Sunday

During Holy Week, we journey from the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday through the drama of Holy Week to the glory of Easter. Whether you are joining us in-person or online, we hope that you will journey with us.

## Palm Sunday (April 13)

## 10:00 am In-Person | 4:00 pm Online

Holy Week begins with the Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday) as we make the journey from Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his utter rejection and crucifixion. Incense may be used at this service.

## Maundy Thursday (April 17)

7:00 pm In-Person

At this celebration of Holy Communion, we remember Jesus's Last Supper and his charge to love one another through the washing of feet. We end the service by stripping the altar. Incense may be used at this service.

### Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday (April 18)

10:00 am In-Person | 4:00 pm Online

Join us we remember Christ's suffering, crucifixion, and death on Good Friday with a service of Scripture, music, and ancient prayers.

## **Good Friday Prayer Walk (April 18)**

11:00 am In-Person

Our Prayer Walk on Good Friday starts & ends at Christ Church. It is approximately 4km of paved pathways in downtown Brampton and along the Etobicoke Creek path. Please note that there is a set of stairs to access the Etobicoke Creek path. All are very welcome to join us. Dogs on-leash are welcome too!

The first service of Easter starts in darkness and with the lighting of the Paschal Candle, light returns to the world. Through music and scripture, we rejoice in the glorious resurrection of the Risen Lord.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! We will gather around Christ's table and join in music, prayer to proclaim Jesus' victory over death and the Good News of the Resurrection. Incense may be used at this service.

# Parish Selection Committee (PSC) | Update

The Christ Church Brampton (CCB) Parish Profile was posted on December 24, 2024 and strong candidates applied. These candidates were passed on by the Bishop to the Parish Selection Committee (PSC). The next steps for the committee have been to:

- 1. Review the candidates
- 2. Interview and short list candidates
- 3. Do second interviews

- 4. Do site visits
- 5. Prayerfully, evaluate who the PSC feels is the best fit for CCB and inform the Bishop
- 6. Work with the Bishop to establish conditions for the new incumbent to start.

We (the PSC members) can report that the above steps are happening and there are no major issues. However, the process is taking a bit longer than expected. Sadly, we cannot provide any additional details due to privacy concerns. But we do look forward to sharing more when we finish the last step.

The entire process has been covered in prayer and filled with the Holy Spirt. As we draw closer to concluding the selection process, we encourage you to join us in the following prayer:

Lord, we thank you for the many blessings Christ Church has enjoyed over the years and especially during this interim season. We pray that you continue to guide the Parish Selection Committee through the crucial final steps of their search for a new incumbent. Please send your Holy Spirit to guide the selection committee and the diocese, so they may clearly and prayerfully discern the way forward to meet the needs and potential of the parish. May the congregation open their hearts to the new incumbent and the ministry you call us to in the years ahead.
